What does the Fund invest in?

The fund seeks long-term capital growth by investing primarily in U.S. equity securities. The Fund will invest primarily in the common stock of mid and large-cap companies that, in the sub-advisor's view, have attractive valuations, leverage long-term competitive advantages, and are expected to provide above-average earnings growth over a market cycle. The fund may invest up to 15% of its net assets in non-U.S. and emerging market securities, typically through sponsored American Depository Receipts (ADRs).

How risky is it?

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with a higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

No guarantees

Like most mutual funds, this fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

Year-by-year returns

Risk rating

Counsel has rated the volatility of this Fund as **medium**.

Because this is a new fund, the risk rating is only an estimate by Counsel. Generally, the rating is based on how much the Fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

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Who is this fund for?

Investors who:

- seek a U.S. equity fund to hold as part of their portfolio
- want a medium to long-term investment
- can handle the volatility of stock markets

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series A securities of the fund.

The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

1. Sales charges

You can only buy this series under the sales charge purchase option.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the fund's returns.

The fund's expenses are made up of the management fee, trading costs and operating expenses (administration fees and Fund Costs, as described in detail in the Simplified Prospectus). The series' annual management fee is 1.90% of the series' value. The series' administration fee is 0.25% of the series' value. Because this fund is new, its Fund Costs and trading costs are not yet available.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the Fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

Counsel pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the fund's management fee and equals 1.00% of the value of your investment each year. This equals \$10.00 per year for every \$1,000 invested.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the Fund.

Fee	What you pay
Switch fees	If you switch between series of the fund or to another Counsel fund, you may pay your representative's firm a switch fee of 0%-2%.
Inappropriate short-term trading fee	A fee of 2% of the amount switched or redeemed may be charged by the fund for inappropriate short-term trading which is defined as trading within a short period of time (less than 30 days) that Counsel believes is detrimental to fund investors.
Excessive short-term trading fee	A fee of 1% of the amount switched or redeemed may be charged by the fund if you invest in the fund for less than 30 days and your trading is part of a pattern of short-term trading that Counsel believes is detrimental to fund investors.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
