What does the Fund invest in?

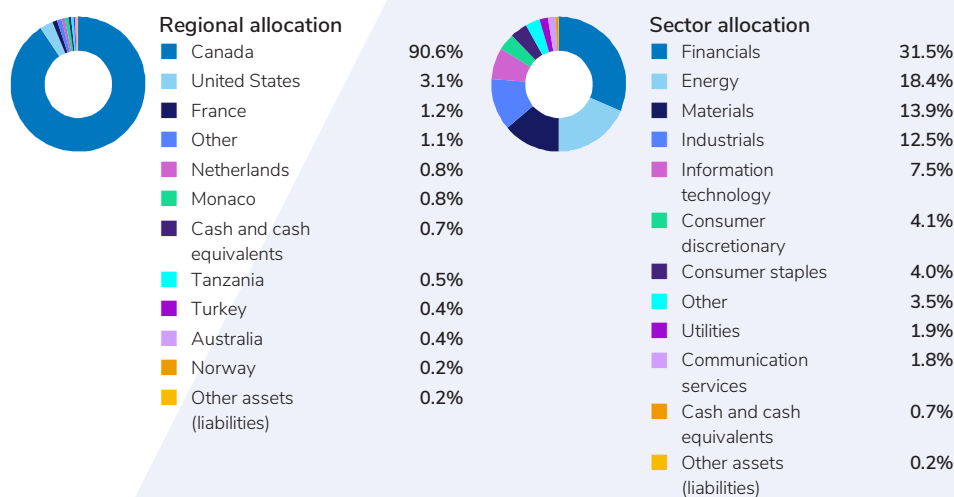
The Fund aims to provide current income and capital growth by primarily investing in common and preferred shares. The Fund invests mainly in Canadian dividend-paying equity securities however, for added diversification the Fund may invest a portion of its assets in capital growth stocks that may not regularly pay dividends, income trusts and in convertible debentures. Generally, the Fund will not invest more than 10% of its assets in foreign securities.

The charts below give you a snapshot of the Fund’s investments on March 31, 2026. The Fund’s investments may change.

How risky is it?

The value of the Fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money. One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund’s returns change over time. This is called “volatility”.

In general, funds with higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

No guarantees

Like most mutual funds, this Fund doesn’t have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

Risk rating

IG Wealth Management has rated the volatility of this Fund as **medium**. This rating is based on how much the Fund’s returns have changed from year to year. It doesn’t tell you how volatile the Fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

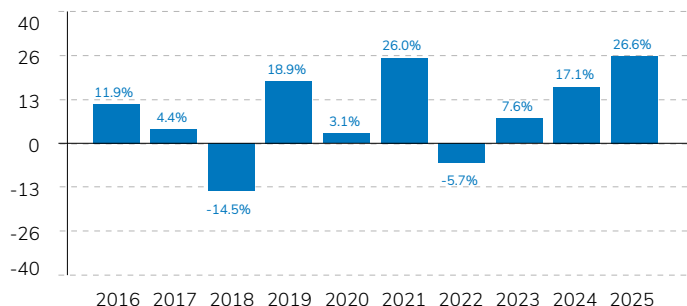
How has the Fund performed?

This section tells you how Series C securities of the Fund have performed over the past 10 years. Returns are after Fund expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the Fund's returns.

The performance of Series J securities would be similar to the performance of Series C securities, but would vary as a result of the difference in the combined management and administration fees compared to Series C as disclosed in the fee decrease table under "Fund expenses" below.

Year-by-year returns

This chart shows how Series C securities of the Fund performed in each of the past 10 years. The Fund dropped in value in 2 of the 10 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Fund will perform in the future.



Best and worst 3-month returns

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series C securities of the Fund in a 3-month period over the past 10 years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

Average return

A person who invested \$1,000 in the Series C securities 10 years ago would have \$2,329 as of March 31, 2026. This is equal to an annual compounded return of approximately 8.8%.

Who is this Fund for?

You should consider investing in this Fund if you are comfortable with the risks for this investment and:

- your long-term investment goal is income with a growth component.

Series C is closed to new investments, but available for investments through switches from same Series of another Fund, reinvestment of distributions and existing pre-authorized contribution arrangements.

A word about tax

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on the Fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the Fund in a registered plan, such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your Fund in a non-registered account, taxable fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

How much does it cost?

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series C and Series J securities of the Fund. The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

We provide eligible investors with combined management and administration fee decreases on their eligible IG Wealth Management Fund investments, as disclosed in the fee decrease table under the sub-heading "Fund expenses". If your household has assets of \$500,000 or more and your overall management and administration fees would be lower in Series J (collectively, the "Eligibility Criteria"), we will automatically switch your Series C securities into Series J securities of the Fund (bearing lower combined management and administration fees). Once you have been switched into Series J of the Fund, you will remain in Series J even if you no longer meet the Eligibility Criteria. 1. Sales charges

Series C and J units are no load. That means you pay no sales charges if you buy, redeem or switch your units.

When you buy this series of the Fund, the Fund manager may pay your IG Advisor a growth bonus of up to 2.75%. The Fund manager may pay your IG Advisor an additional payment of up to 40% of the growth bonus if they were appointed before October 1, 2023, and are in their first four years with us. For Advisors appointed after September 30, 2023, they will not receive an additional payment.

2. Fund expenses

You don't pay these expenses directly. These expenses reduce the annual return of the Series. Series C has higher combined management and administration fees than Series J. As of September 30, 2025, the Fund's expenses for each Series were as follows:

Clients who hold Series C are eligible to receive a rebate of some or all of the service fee paid by the Fund on their investment as outlined in the Fund's simplified prospectus.

3. Other fees

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the Fund.

Fee	What you pay
Inappropriate Short-term trading fee	If you initiate a combination of purchases and redemptions, including switches into, or out from, the Fund within 30 days, your switches could have a detrimental effect on other Fund investors, and that may take advantage of Funds with investments priced in other time zones or illiquid investments that trade infrequently. We may charge you 2.00% of the amount you switch. This fee is payable to the Fund.
Excessive Short-term trading fee	If you initiate a combination of purchases and redemptions, including switches into, or out from, the Fund within 30 days, your switches could have a detrimental effect on other Fund investors, and we may charge you up to 2.00% of the amount you switch. This fee is payable to the Fund.

What if I change my mind?

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.

More about the trailing commission

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the Fund. It is for the services and advice that your IG Advisor provides to you.

The Fund manager pays the trailing commission to your IG Advisor. It is paid in whole or in part from the Fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment. The rate ranges between:

- 0.40% to 0.70% per year (\$4.00 to \$7.00 per year for every \$1,000 invested).
