**What does the fund invest in?**

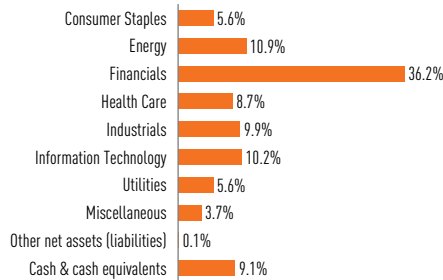
The fund invests in Canadian companies that pay a dividend. It is anticipated that approximately 30% of the fund's assets may be invested in foreign securities, although the weighting of foreign securities may vary from time to time.

**How risky is it?**

The value of the fund can go down as well as up. You could lose money.

One way to gauge risk is to look at how much a fund's returns change over time. This is called "volatility".

In general, funds with a higher volatility will have returns that change more over time. They typically have a greater chance of losing money and may have a greater chance of higher returns. Funds with lower volatility tend to have returns that change less over time. They typically have lower returns and may have a lower chance of losing money.

**Risk rating**

Stone Asset Management Limited has rated the volatility of this fund as **low to medium**.

This rating is based on how much the fund's returns have changed from year to year. It doesn't tell you how volatile the fund will be in the future. The rating can change over time. A fund with a low risk rating can still lose money.

**No guarantees**

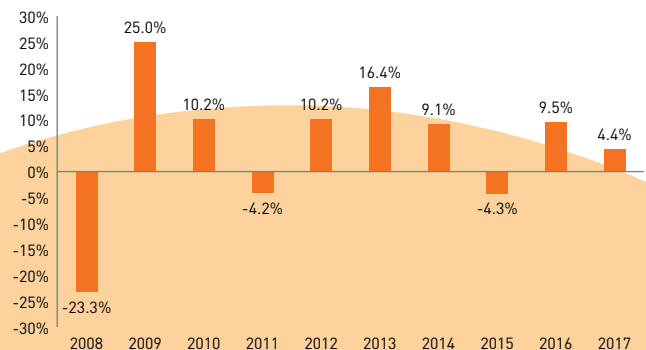
Like most mutual funds, this fund doesn't have any guarantees. You may not get back the amount of money you invest.

**How has the fund performed?**

This section tells you how Series B securities of the fund has performed over the past 10 years. Returns are after expenses have been deducted. These expenses reduce the fund's returns.

**Year-by-year returns**

The bar chart shows how the Series of the fund performed in each of the past 10 years. The fund's Series value has decreased in 3 of the past 10 years. The range of returns and change from year to year can help you assess how risky the Series of the fund has been in the past. It does not tell you how the Series of the fund will perform in the future.



**Best and worst 3-month returns**

This table shows the best and worst returns for Series B securities of the fund in a 3-month period over the past 10 years. The best and worst 3-month returns could be higher or lower in the future. Consider how much of a loss you could afford to take in a short period of time.

**Average return**

The annual compound return of the Series of the fund was approximately 4.4% over the past 10 years. If you had invested \$1,000 in the Series of the fund 10 years ago, your investment would now be worth \$1,532.75.

**Who is this fund for?**

**This fund is suitable for investors:**

- Seeking capital growth and dividends
- With a mid-term to long-term investment horizon with a low to medium risk tolerance

This fund may not be suitable for investors with a short-term investment horizon.

**A word about tax**

In general, you'll have to pay income tax on any money you make on a fund. How much you pay depends on the tax laws where you live and whether or not you hold the fund in a registered plan such as a Registered Retirement Savings Plan or a Tax-Free Savings Account.

Keep in mind that if you hold your fund in a non-registered account, fund distributions are included in your taxable income, whether you get them in cash or have them reinvested.

Switches of shares between classes of shares of a mutual fund corporation, including the Corporate Funds, will result in a taxable disposition of those shares at their market value. Such disposition may result in a capital gain or capital loss for you.

**How much does it cost?**

The following tables show the fees and expenses you could pay to buy, own and sell Series B securities of the fund.

The fees and expenses – including any commissions – can vary among series of a fund and among funds. Higher commissions can influence representatives to recommend one investment over another. Ask about other funds and investments that may be suitable for you at a lower cost.

**1. Sales charges**

Series B is the deferred sales charge option.

**2. Fund Expenses**

You don't pay these expenses directly. They affect you because they reduce the returns of the fund.

As at December 31, 2017, the fund's expenses were 3.48% of its value. This equals \$34.80 for every \$1,000 invested.

The fund may pay the Manager a performance fee equal to 10 percent of the amount by which the series of the fund's rate of return exceeds that of its benchmark subject to a maximum of 0.30 percent of the fund's average net asset value. The benchmark for the Fund is 80% of the S&P/TSX Composite Index plus 20% of the S&P 500 Index.

**4. Other Fees**

You may have to pay other fees when you buy, hold, sell or switch securities of the fund.

<b>Fee</b>	<b>What you pay</b>
<b>Switch or change fee</b>	Your representative's firm may charge you a fee of up to 2% of the value of securities switched or changed.
<b>Short-term trading fee</b>	2% of the value of securities you redeem or switch within 90 days of purchase. This fee goes to the fund.

**3. More about the trailing commission**

The trailing commission is an ongoing commission. It is paid for as long as you own the fund. It is for the services and advice that your representative and their firm provide to you.

Stone Asset Management Limited pays the trailing commission to your representative's firm. It is paid from the fund's management fee and is based on the value of your investment.

The trailing commission for Series B is 0.50% of the average value of your investment. This equals \$5 for every \$1,000 invested. If purchased through a discount broker, 0.25% of the average value of your investment. This equals \$2.50 for every \$1,000 invested.

**What if I change my mind?**

Under securities law in some provinces and territories, you have the right to:

- withdraw from an agreement to buy mutual fund securities within two business days after you receive a simplified prospectus or Fund Facts document, or
- cancel your purchase within 48 hours after you receive confirmation of the purchase.

In some provinces and territories, you also have the right to cancel a purchase, or in some jurisdictions, claim damages, if the simplified prospectus, annual information form, Fund Facts document or financial statements contain a misrepresentation. You must act within the time limit set by the securities law in your province or territory.
